

FireSmart actions reduce the risk of wildfire damage to your home.

Tasks to help you get started:

- Clean gutters and roofs.
- Clear leaves and debris from decks and balconies.
- Keep grass and weeds under 10 cm.
- Store firewood and lumber 10-30 m from structures.
- Move propane tanks 10-30 m away from structures.
- Keep combustible vegetation at least 10 m away from propane tanks.
- Trim trees to achieve a 2 m clearance from the ground
- Apply these standards to sheds and outbuildings.

Based on Research:

FireSmart recommendations are grounded in wildfire science. Research shows that homes are often ignited not by a large wall of flame, but by embers, radiant heat, and nearby combustible materials. The findings below highlight some of the key factors that influence how homes ignite during wildfires.

- Embers are one of the leading causes of home ignitions during wildfires.
- Embers can travel well ahead of the fire front, igniting vulnerable areas around homes and buildings.
- Reducing combustible materials near the home is one of the most effective ways to lower wildfire risk.
- The first 1.5 metres around the home is the most critical zone to remove combustible materials.
- Managing vegetation and other fuels within 10 metres of the home further reduces risk.
- Steep slopes and highly flammable vegetation can increase a home's exposure to wildfire.
